A Life Changing Experience! Submitted by Renee Brown

Twenty-five years ago, I was 16, newly licensed, and playing Bon Jovi's "It's My Life" on repeat in my car. I decided it was going to be a great summer; it was now or never! So, just over 25 years ago was when I walked



into the interview room with a York Twinning representative. "J'ai mal à la gorge," I remember apologizing. The conversation went better than expected, and I was accepted to live with a French family near Arles for three weeks, after which I would host the French student in return.

My French sister Pauline, her best friend Eva, and me with another YTA student named Rachel.

Looking back at the pictures I took while abroad and what I wrote in scrapbooks about those six weeks with my host sister Pauline, I truly believe being part of York Twinning changed my life. I was a shy, quiet teenager who didn't recognize her own abilities. I wasn't even expecting to be accepted to the program, but in the end, I was placed with a completely non-English-speaking family, and both my French and confidence flourished.

That summer of 2000, seven of us flew to the south of France. We met occasionally for group experiences, but the bulk of my time was in a small village in Provence, called Mouriès, with the Villard family, whom I adored from the moment I met them. On the drive home they chatted to me at lightning speed about the cicadas – a

word I had definitely *not* learned in my high school French class. We did the historical and cultural highlights: seeing a bull fight in the Arles arena that (to me) looked exactly like the Colosseum, swimming

in the Mediterranean Sea, touring the Palais des Pape in Avignon, and visiting ruins of a chateau – Les Baux de Provence.

Arles, the Villard family, and York Twinning truly hold a special place in my heart for more than those bucket list items. It was moments with the people there, moments that I never even thought to put on a bucket list, that impacted me the most. Twenty-five years later, I still vividly recall being in a pub to watch France eke out a victorious golden goal over Italy during the European Championships (Euro Cup) that summer in 2000; the entire pub erupted and sang Aretha Franklin's "I Will Survive." I will never forget being in a car and understanding my first joke in French; it was a pun on the word Roquefort and the French word for loud - fort. I still tell the story of how we were watching bulls run through the tiny streets of Mouriès on Bastille Day – mainly because one of the bulls ended up stuck in a fence and nearly killed us. Thankfully, everyone, including the bull, was safe in the end. I remember sitting in a village square at a town fête with my new French friends thinking to myself, how can it get better?

When Pauline flew back to America with me, we reciprocated experiences as best we could with trips to the beach and Washington, DC. She kept telling us that she wanted to "drink a tea with Hillary Clinton," who was First Lady at that time.

What York Twinning offered me wasn't just a chance to learn French or see a new place. It offered me a chance to learn who I was, to learn what I was capable of, to meet people who would change me for the better, to find that I wanted to travel more because I could do what had seemed too big for someone from a small town in southeastern Pennsylvania. The next summer, I would return to Mouriès, on my own, and stay another week with the famille Villard. I would choose to continue my French language education through college, earning a minor and going abroad for another summer to study in Nancy, France. The courage I gained and what I learned about myself during those three weeks with York Twinning rippled into other adventures. I learned I was capable of more, and that courage and confidence eventually led me to a semester abroad in the UK during college where I met my now-husband.

Getting on a plane at age 16 without anyone I knew, flying to a country where I spoke the language on an elementary level, and going home with people I had never even seen pictures of was one of the best decisions I ever made. I can't hear Bon Jovi's song without smelling the lavender, hearing the cicadas, and thinking of how lucky I was to have had that time in Provence. It was a great summer and helped me take the next step toward a great future.

YTA Adult Exchange to Leinfelden-Echterdingen (LE), Germany June 25th to July 2nd

Twenty-two YTA members arrived in LE on June 25, 2025, and began a week long exchange filled with fun and exciting adventures organized by our gracious hosts and members of the LE-York Club.

Our adventures began the next morning with a trip to Hohenzollern Castle. This beautiful building is the third of three castles built at the top of Mount Hohenzollern. The first was destroyed during a war in 1423. The second was demolished after falling into disrepair at the

beginning of the 19th Century. Following a self-guided tour through the castle members enjoyed lunch

in the biergarten before heading to visit the town of Tubingen.













We took a walking tour then were treated to a ride down the Neckar River on a flat-bottomed boat called Stocherkahn. YTA member Elijah Henning even had a chance to be a punter and push our boat up the river. The day ended with an early dinner along the river.









June 27th began with a lovely reception hosted by Mayor Otto Rupanner on the lawn of Leinfelden City Hall. We next took a train to Stuttgart and did a walking tour of the area before enjoying lunch at Kursall. Lunch was followed by a tour of the Daimler-Gewachshaus where we saw the world's first motorcycle invented by Gottlieb Daimler. We then walked through a park with a mineral spring and stopped outside an English church before boarding a train back to Leinfelden. Doug Stein even saw a sticker in the park that said I Love PSU!

The rest of the evening was spent enjoying the 50th anniversary celebration of Leinfelden-Echterdingen. Mayor Ruppaner started off the event by tapping a keg and giving a big cheer to everyone in attendance. It was a great time for food, fun, and friendship. Steins even got to meet up with Leon, a student who participated in the 2024 student LE-York exchange program. The celebration continued late into the evening with both traditional German and American music by performing



YTA members spent the weekend visiting a variety of places with our host families. Some members visited the city of Heidelberg. Others visited Fernsehturm Stuttgart, the world's first telecommunications tower in the world constructed from concrete. Some went to the Mercedes-Bentz Museum where they got to see a Pope Mobile while others visited the Porsche Museum with interactive exhibits and a collection of famous race cars. Others visited a flower market, did some shopping and met with some other families for dinner before going back to enjoy more time at the 50th anniversary celebration!



June 30th the group was taken to see Lampoldshausen German Aerospace Center. A tour guide told us the history of European space flight, space propulsion systems, and on-going research to evaluate and test new, environmentally friendly fuels. After lunch we were taken to the medieval town of Bad Wimpfen where we went on a guided tour and walked on cobblestone roads viewing various half-timbered homes along the way. The views from Bad Wimpfen's palace were fantastic.

On the last day of our exchange we took a guided tour of the city of Esslingen. A historic old town along the Neckar River near Stuttgart, it has many old half-timbered homes and churches of different styles. One church has a walkway built between two towers to provide support. The Old Town Hall is a beautiful building that has a glockenspiel, astronomical clock, that plays several times every day except Sunday. Another interesting building is a 13th century gate tower once used to defend the city. It is now decorated with a hanging sculpture by artist Hubert von der Goltz, of what looks like a man walking on a tight rope. There is now an ice cream shop on the ground floor.









Later in the day we toured the Kessler Wine cellar. Kessler was established over 200 years ago and is Germany's oldest sparkling wine producer. After learning about its history and a short tour, we were treated to some delicious samples.









We made a mad dash in the rain to catch our train back to LE before attending a wonderful farewell dinner with our host families and LE-York Club members. It was great to have the whole group back together and share stories about our many adventures.



July 2nd our exchange trip came to an end. There were lots of hugs, and some tears, as we said auf Wiedersehen to both old and new friends from Leinfelden-Echterdingen. Thank you LE-York Club for a fantastic exchange experience. We look forward to continuing and growing our friendships in years to come!



Winners of YTA Scholarships

Carolyn Van Newkirk, a longtime member of York Twinning Association, passed away recently. Below is her obituary as posted in both The York Dispatch and The York Daily Record.

Carolyn J. "Skipper" Van Newkirk, Ed. D. age 87, of York, died at 1:15 PM Sunday, August 10, 2025, at Wellspan York Hospital. She was the wife of the late Jack C. Van Newkirk, PhD. Born September 22, 1937, in Ephrata, she was the daughter of the late Albert and Thelma (Watkins) Harris. She earned her Bachelor's Degree from West Chester State Teachers College (where she recently received a Distinguished Alumni Award), and Master's and Doctorate in Education Administration from William and Mary College. She had over 40 plus years in education and retired as the Lower School Principal of Beth Tfiloh Community Day School in Baltimore.

She earned her Pilots License at age 50 and was a member of Ninety-Nines, Inc. International Organization of Women Pilots where she competed in 25 aviation races and has landed in all 48 contiguous United States and Canada. She also served on the Board of Directors of the Susquehanna Area Regional Airport Authority which operates Harrisburg International Airport, Capital City Airport, Gettysburg Regional Airport, and Franklin County Regional Airport. Dr. Van Newkirk is survived by a son, David C. Van Newkirk, of Dover, Delaware; a daughter, Lauri L. Altman, and her husband Philip, of Belcamp, Maryland; one grandson, Jess and two granddaughters Nicole, and Sydney. She was also preceded in death by her brother, Albert S. Harris.
